

PayPal Setup

Menu Access: *Stores > Configuration > Sales > Payment Methods*

You will need a free PayPal Business Account to complete this section. Visit <https://www.paypal.com/us/webapps/mpp/referral/paypal-business-account2>

1. From the Stores menu
2. Choose Configuration
3. Click on Sales.
4. Then click on Payment Methods.
5. Then, under Merchant Location you will see the PayPal option. **CLICK** configure.

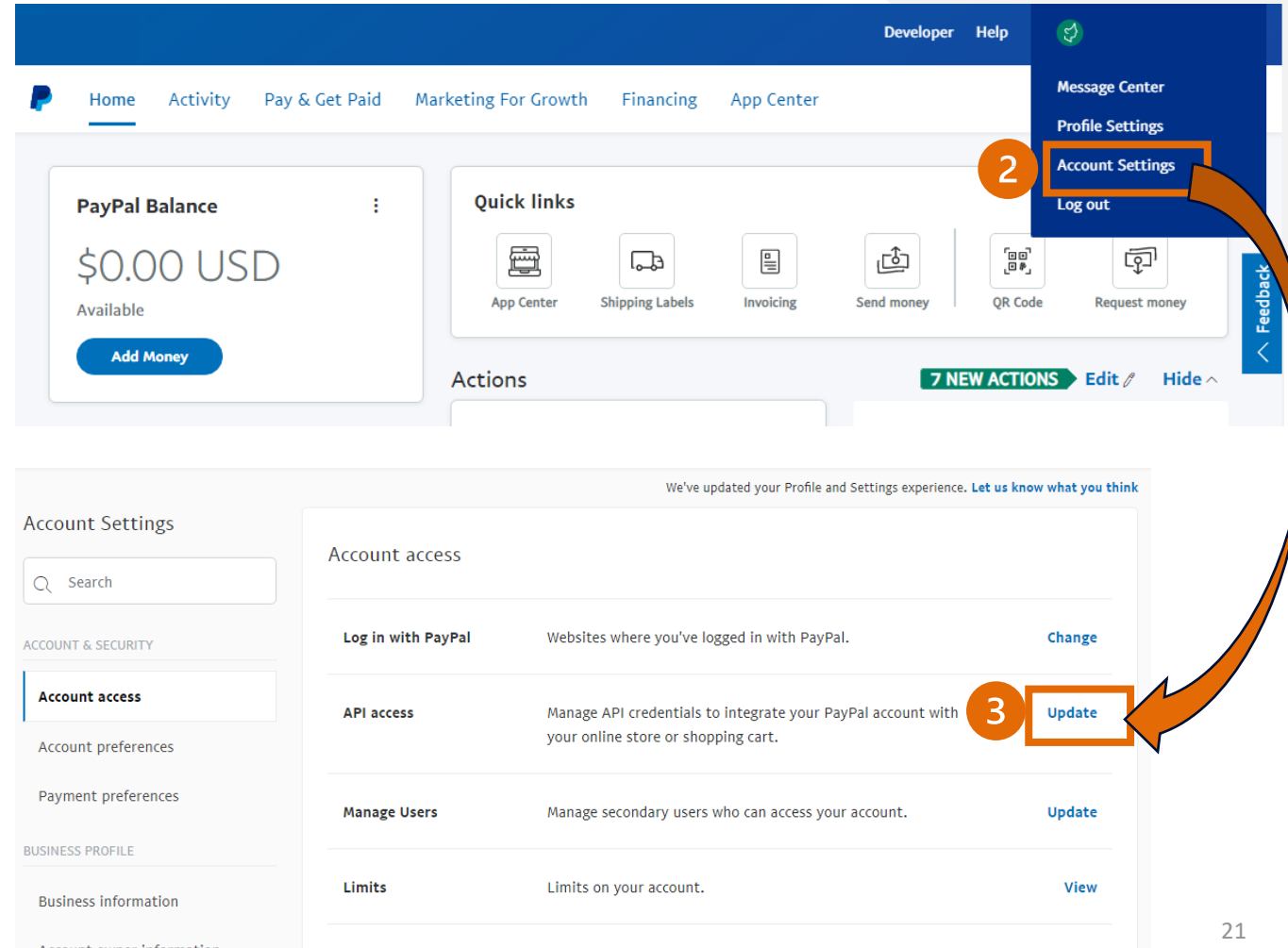
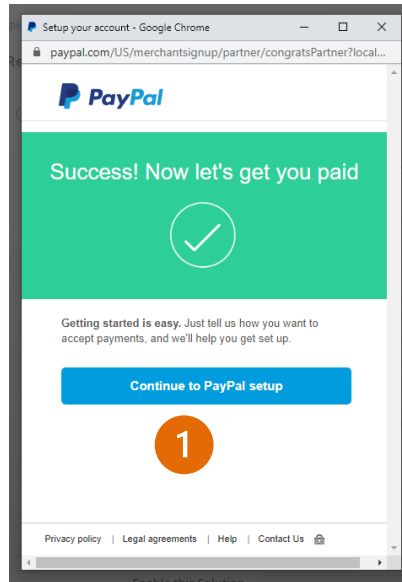
Menu Access: *Store > Configuration > Sales > Payment Methods*

1. Click **Configure** next to PayPal Express Checkout. The screen will extend to show the PayPal settings.
2. Enter the email address you use for your PayPal account
3. In the API Authentication Methods section, set the drop-down menu to **API Signature**.
4. Then click the gray **Get Credentials from PayPal** button.
5. A PayPal popup will appear. Enter your email address.
6. Then click **NEXT**.
7. A second popup will appear. Enter your PayPal password and click the blue **Log In** button.

1. You'll see a success screen. Click on the blue Continue to PayPal setup button.
2. Hover over your name on the top right and then select "Account Settings" from the drop-down menu.
3. On the Account Settings page, click "Update" on the API access line.



PayPal Setup

Menu Access: NVP/SOAP API Integration > Manage API Credentials

1. On the “Your Payment API credentials” screen
2. Scroll down to the Custom Checkout Experience find the NVP/SOAP API Integration (Classic) section.
3. Click on “Manage API Credentials”.
4. You’ll then see the “View or Remove API Signature” screen. Here, you’ll click “Show” to display your API Username, API Password, and Signature.

Braintree SDK integration

The Braintree SDK is powered by Braintree, a PayPal service. These easy to integrate SDKs allow you to accept payments via PayPal on your website and native mobile apps.

PayPal Setup

Menu Access: *Store > Configuration > EMC > Sales > Payment Methods*

1. Click “Show” next to API Username on the PayPal Screen and then copy the code and paste it into the API Username text box on the PayPal Settings screen on your admin panel.
2. Follow the steps for API Password and API Signature.
3. Be sure “Enable this Solution” is set to “Yes.”
4. Then press the “Save Config” button on the top right. Your website is now connected to PayPal!
